

# The John Bray Medallist 2024



## JOHN BRAY ALUMNI NETWORK

### Rules

#### Nominees must:

1. Demonstrate sustained and significant contributions in one or more of the following areas: Humanitarian Service, Professional Excellence and/or Outstanding Community Service, whether to the law or any other discipline.
2. Through their professional or volunteer work, demonstrate a significant positive impact that is recognised by peers – locally, nationally and/or internationally.
3. Demonstrate leadership qualities in a variety of contexts that could include volunteering, community or professional work.

#### Eligibility Requirements

- Any living person who has been conferred a law degree offered by the University of Adelaide Law School, whether it be undergraduate, graduate or postgraduate. This includes but is not limited to LLB, LLB(Hons), LLM, MBL, MPhil and PhD. Honorary degree recipients will not be considered, unless that individual has also completed and been awarded a law degree from the University of Adelaide Law School.
- Self-nominations are not accepted.
- Posthumous nominations will not be considered.
- Current John Bray Alumni Network Committee Members, current University of Adelaide Council members, and current University of Adelaide Law School Advisory Board members are not eligible for nomination.
- Current University of Adelaide staff, who are Adelaide Law School alumni, are eligible to be nominated.

#### Assessment

A committee, comprising three representatives of the John Bray Alumni Network, will review all nominations and make recommendations to the President of the Network.

The Awards Committee reserves the right to make no award in a particular year. The decision of the selection panel will be final and conclusive, no correspondence regarding decisions will be entered into.

#### Nomination Conditions and Procedure

- Nominations for The John Bray Medal may be submitted by alumni, former and current staff of the University of Adelaide, and the wider community.
- An alumnus cannot be awarded The John Bray Medal more than once.
- Supporting evidence, such as awards, media clippings, etc (maximum of three attachments) should be included with the application.
- Previous unsuccessful nominations for the John Bray Medal can be re-submitted by the nominator in future years, with a new application containing any updated information.
- The John Bray Alumni Network reserves the right to disclose the identity of the nominator to the nominee.
- The nominator's and/or selected nominee's name, image and statement may be published and/or used in any form of media, in any context pertaining to The John Bray Medal.
- The John Bray Alumni Network will investigate and assess nominations made in any way it considers fit.
