# Pre-enrolment English Program

The Pre-enrolment English Program (PEP) is a direct entry pathway for students that have not met the minimum English language entry requirements of their University of Adelaide undergraduate or postgraduate program.

The length of your program depends on your English language proficiency test score.

If you successfully complete the PEP at the required level, you do not need to sit another English test before entering your University program.

The PEP is offered in lengths of 10, 15, 20, 25, 30 and 35 weeks.

The PEP Extended 30 and 35 week courses combine General English for Academic Purposes (GEAP) classes and Pre-enrolment English Program (PEP) classes. Commencing in the GEAP allows you to further develop the fundamental linguistic building blocks of grammar and vocabulary for academic level study, before progressing to English classes specifically tailored to prepare you for entry to your award program.

- **PEP Extended 30 week** students will complete 5 weeks of GEAP before commencing 25 weeks of PEP classes.
- **PEP Extended 35 week** students will complete 10 weeks of GEAP before commencing 25 weeks of PEP classes.

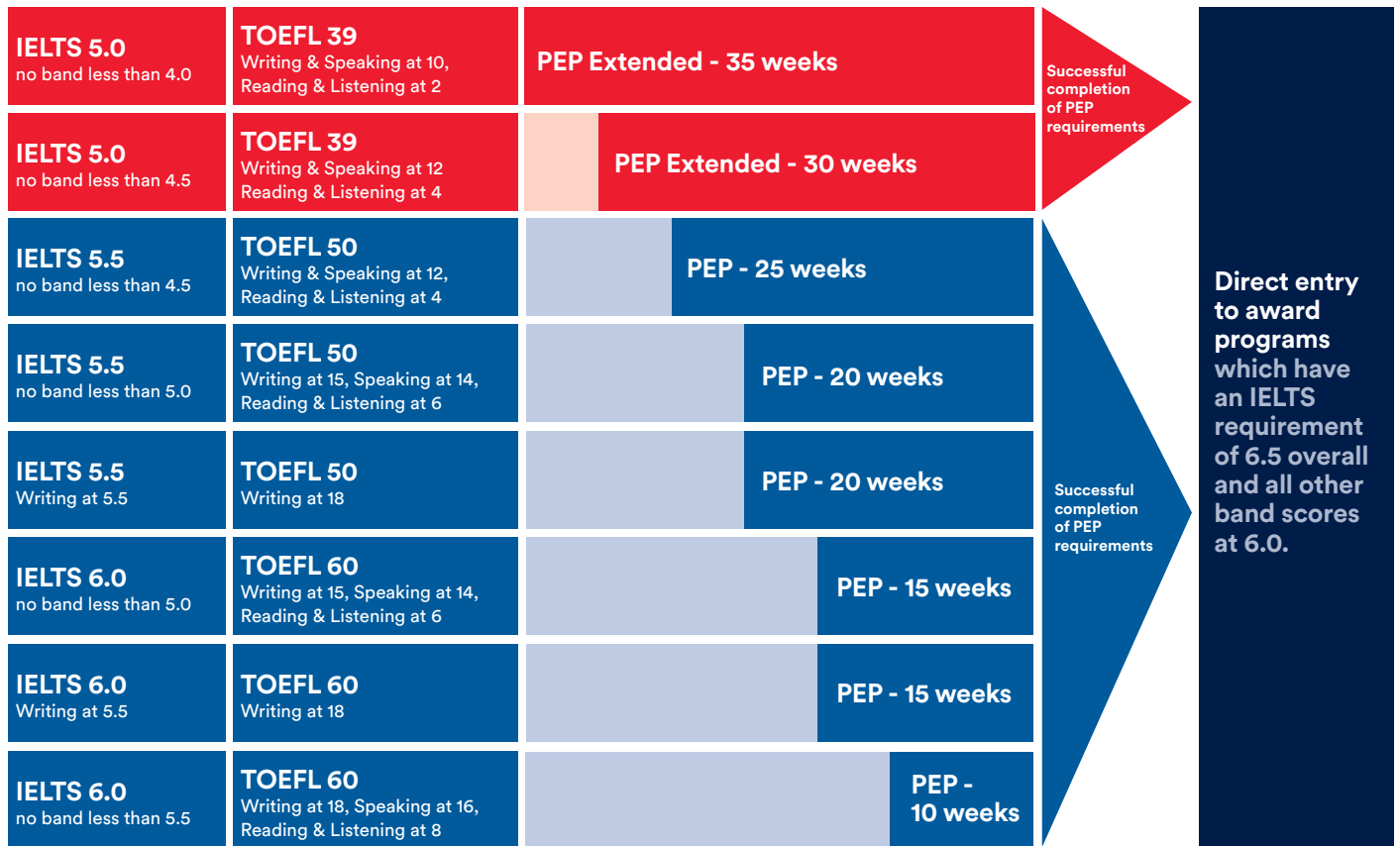

For students commencing award programs which have an IELTS requirement of 6.5 overall and all other band scores at 6.0

# General English for Academic Purposes

The General English for Academic Purposes (GEAP) program is for students who wish to develop their language skills at one of the most prestigious universities in Australia.

GEAP offers something for all students, from beginners with basic English skills to advanced students seeking high level tuition. To ensure you are enrolled in the appropriate level, you will sit a short placement test before your first class. The test involves reading, writing and listening and assesses vocabulary, grammar, written expression and the understanding of meaning in a conversation.

You can study the GEAP as a stand-alone program for personal or professional advancement or to gain credit towards a degree in your home university. GEAP can also be used as a pathway to the University of Adelaide if you have not met the minimum English requirements for the Pre-Enrolment English program (PEP).

## Design your own GEAP

To help you achieve your own personal language goals, you can customise your GEAP program by choosing a Friday GEAP Specialisation class that best suits your needs.

- Global Communication Skills
- Global Citizenship
- Australian Studies and Popular Culture
- Academic Skills Preparation and TOEFL
- IELTS Preparation
- Book Club

## GEAP fast facts

**Duration:** 20 contact hours per week. You can choose the length of your program - from 5 to 45 weeks (enrolment is in 5 week blocks).

**Start dates:** every 5 weeks throughout the year.

**Entry criteria:** There are no specific entry requirements for the GEAP program. It is suitable for all levels.

**Levels:** 5 levels from elementary to advanced.

**Class times:** 9.00am - 1.00pm, Monday - Friday or 1.30pm - 5.30pm, Monday - Friday

Each student will have a combination of morning and afternoon classes each week.

**Fee:** \$535 per week in 2023, \$600 per week in 2024

Students are responsible for the cost of Health Insurance.

Our English as a Medium of Instruction (EMI) program has been specifically designed to support University educators who are looking to teach their content in English.

Our unique 'EMI Resource Hub' is designed to make it simple for instructors of all levels of ability and confidence to incorporate more English taught content into their curriculum and their classes, whether you are just starting to introduce English into your program, or you are already doing so and are looking to take your teaching to the next level. The program will introduce a range of active learning techniques and a model for EMI classes that can be applied to educators classes, regardless of the subject.

This is a practical, hands-on program which combines theoretical input with teaching practice sessions which will allow participants to practice the content, develop their confidence and get individual feedback from our team of experienced trainers.

## What is the 'EMI Resource Hub'?

This unique software tool has been designed by the University of Adelaide to support EMI educators in lesson planning. Users can select the amount of English taught content they wish to introduce into classes, and filter recommendations accordingly to their needs, based on broad discipline area, preparation time available, mode of delivery and other parameters. Participants on the program will continue to have access to this tool upon completion of the program.

## Who is the program for?

This program has been designed for University lecturers and educators who would like to teach some or all of their content in English. Whilst there are no fixed entry requirements, we recommend that attendees have an IELTS's score of 5.5, or equivalent, for effective learning.
