Faculty of Arts, Business, Law and Economics

All students

- Course readers (not compulsory also available in Library).
- · Postgraduate students will be charged cost price for printing once quota has been met.
- · Non-compulsory student materials e.g., Lecture Notes, Readings, Cases available to print via MyUni.
- Optional Study Tours and Field trips costs to be determined closer to the date.

School of Education students

- Postgraduate students will be charged cost price for printing once quota has been met. 2-year Masters students can request extra printing credits for 9-unit research projects.
- First year students in any B Teaching programs will require the use of an iPad (6th gen, Pro or later); Apple Pencil or Logitech Crayon; suitable iPad keyboard. If students do not own a device which meets the requirement the equipment will be available for subsidised purchase (approx. \$600-\$700) through an online portal.
- All Teacher Education students need to undertake Working with Children Checks from the Department for Communities and Social Inclusion (DCSI). The fee as of 1 July 2024 is \$64.50 (GST included) per application for all students on placement. Costs generally rise every 6 months though usually only by a small amount. Clearances are valid for a maximum of five (5) years. This requirement is outlined in the Standards for dealing with the information obtained about the criminal history of employees and volunteers who work with children, pursuant to the Child Safety (Prohibited Persons) Act 2016. Placement venues may require additional screening depending on their organisational policies and requirements. Students should budget for renewal.
- NOTE: Valid for Commencing Domestic and Commencing International Students.
- Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education Students Literacy and numeracy components (full test) \$196. Reimbursement for a successful Literacy component can be claimed from the School of Education.
- Responding to Risks of Harm, Abuse and Neglect Education and Care (RRHAN-EC) courses Fundamentals (2hrs) Free and Masterclass (4hrs facilitated) Approximately \$69.00. The Department for Education SA provides information on approved training organisations offering the course.

School of Humanities

- For MDIA 2222, MDIA 2229, MDIA 1018: students are required to purchase consumables such as markers, paints & brushes, coloured paper, glue, cutting mat, cutting knife (prices vary significantly based on student choices, approx. \$30 \$100)
- For MDIA 2223, MDIA 2224, MDIA 7010, MDIA 7011, MDIA 7012, MDIA 7013, MDIA 7223: students are required to purchase a high speed USB drive, at least 16GB in size (\$15 \$30)
- For MDIA 2212, MDIA 2213, MDIA 3316It is recommended that students purchase a DSLR or Mirrorless camera, with memory card, lens selection and tripod (wide range of prices entry level devices usually around \$400-\$1000).
- For MDIA 2222, MDIA 2229: Optional, only if student wishes to purchase and only if they are experienced in illustration Wacom Intuos drawing tablet (prices range \$130 \$550)
- For SPAN, all Spanish courses students are strongly encouraged to buy an e-workbook, which is 4.99 euro (AU\$8.4).
- For MUSEUM 7007 students will be required to provide/source their own transport to and from the South Australian Museum offsite storage facilities
- $\bullet \ \text{MUSEUM 7006}. \ \text{This course involves multiple trips to the Clare Valley and will incur transport costs of up to \$400.}$
- MUSEUM 7004 students *may* be required to pay for transport to their internship location and accommodation. They may also have food and other living costs if their internship is away from their place of residence.

Faculty of Health and Medical Sciences

All students

Criminal History and Background Clearances

- All students undertaking <u>clinical placements</u> are required to have a National Police Clearance and Department of Human Services (DHS) screening. Please note students undertaking research activity in a clinical setting will also need clearances.
- Students will either be directed how to Apply for a DHS screening check as an individual or the faculty's Placement team will register your details with the Screening Unit, including your name, date of birth and email address. DHS clearances may include some or all of the below:
 - 1. Working with Children Check
 - 2. Vulnerable Person Related
 - 3. Aged Care Sector
 - 4. General Employment Probity
 - 5. NDIS Worker Check
- If the Screening Unit does not identify any risk requiring assessment, the turnaround time for your clearance should be approximately 20 business days, so please apply as early as possible to ensure your placement is not delayed or cancelled.
- The cost to the student is \$64.50 (GST included) per application. One application will cover any checks listed.
- Criminal history and background clearances are valid for a maximum of three (3) years with the exception of Working with Children which is valid for (5) years. Clinical placement venues may require more frequent screening, depending on its organisational policies and requirements.
- Students need to budget for renewal.

National Police Clearance (NPC)

- All students undertaking placements or undertaking research in clinical facilities are required to have an NPC. The cost is \$20 (GST included).
 Clinical placement venues may expect students to apply for another NPC screening prior to placement commencement, depending on its organisational policies and requirements.
- Students need to budget for renewal.
- Commencing International Students MUST obtain the equivalent Police Check from their home country in addition to Australian criminal history checks.

Immunisation and PCI screening

- Students undertaking clinical placements are required to have the appropriate level of immunisation and PCI screening. Evidence of Immunisation and PCI screening is required by clinical venues prior to placements. Please note this may also be necessary for students undertaking research activity in a clinical setting.
- Prior to commencing placements, students are advised to consult their general practitioner or local government immunisation service to be screened and immunised for infectious diseases as outlined in <u>SA Health's Addressing vaccine preventable disease</u>: <u>Occupational assessment, screening</u>, and vaccination policy 2024.
- GP consultation at the University Health Practice to review immunisation history/PCI screening is \$52.85. Immunisation and screening costs will vary subject to individual requirements.

Bachelor of Health and Medical Sciences (BHMS) and Bachelor of Health and Medical Sciences (Advanced) (BHMSA) students

- · During practical sessions and lab placements, students are required to comply with professional dress standards.
 - a. Lab coat approximately \$40, available at The Adelaide Store
- It is recommended all Year 1 BHMS (Advanced) students provide a lock to secure items when using the Simulation Clinic.

Adelaide Dental School

Bachelor of Dental Surgery (BDS) students

- There are associated costs up to \$400 for Mandatory Clinical Placement Checks (Police clearances, vaccinations/serology) in Year 1.
- It is recommended all students provide a lock to secure items when using the Simulation Clinic Years 1-4 and Year 1 at Gilles Plains clinic.
- · During clinical training and placements students are required to comply with professional dress standards:
 - a. White lab coat \$40
 - b. Blue clinic coat \$55
 - c. Protective eyewear (approved standard) up to \$25 (must comply with Australian and New Zealand standards)
 - d. Over shields if wearing prescription lenses or dental loupes up to \$25 to \$100 depending on type
 - e. Dental Loupes are recommended (not compulsory) and students may purchase them from Year 2 onwards. Dental Loupes must comply with Australian and New Zealand standards. Prices range widely depending on the type purchased \$2000-\$3000
- Some travel and living costs will be incurred for clinical placements in community and rural clinic locations/clinic venues located outside of CBD area during the five years of the program.

BDS Equipment (approximate costs)

- First Year: Instrument kits, instrument cassettes, Standard Adult and Periodontal Nissin models (plastic upper and lower arch models and Periodontal Nissin model, wax carving teeth and manikin face mask; Practice shape cutting blocks for simulation activity \$2800 \$3200.
- Second year: Replacement Plastic Nissin Teeth \$385
- Third Year: Replacement Plastic Nissin Teeth for PCPC, Restorative, Paediatric, Endodontic and Fixed Prosthodontic simulation activities \$1200 \$1600. Endodontic model \$320.
- · Fourth Year:
 - Replacement Plastic Nissin Teeth for Endodontic and Fixed Prosthodontic simulation activities \$550 \$800. Some travel costs may be incurred for clinical placements (community clinics).
 - b. SA Dental Service Card is required for those students at Noarlunga clinic \$10.
- · Fifth year:
 - a. Travel and living costs may be incurred for clinical placements (community, rural and/or interstate). Some costs are incurred for mandatory clinical placement checks by interstate placement providers.
 - b. SA Dental Service Card is required for those students at Noarlunga clinic \$10.

Bachelor of Oral Health (BOH) students

- There are associated costs up to \$400 for Mandatory Clinical Placement Checks (Police clearances, vaccinations/serology) in Year 1.
- It is recommended all students provide a lock to secure items when using the Simulation Clinic Years 1-3 and Year 1 at Gilles Plains clinic.
- · During Clinical training and placements students are required to comply with professional dress standards:
 - a. White lab coat: \$40
 - b. Blue clinic coat: \$55
 - c. Protective eyewear (approved standard) up to \$25 (must comply with Australian and New Zealand standards)
 - d. Over shields if wearing prescription lenses up to \$25
- Some travel costs will be incurred for clinical placements in community and rural clinic locations/clinic venues located outside of CBD area during the three years of the program.

BOH Equipment (approximate costs)

- Second year:

 - Dental Loupes are recommended for use by students. (Loupes must comply with Australian and New Zealand standards) prices range widely depending on the type purchased \$2000-\$3000
- Third Year:
 - a. Some travel costs may be incurred for field placements including \$200 refundable security deposit for accommodation in some instances. Living expenses will also be incurred for rural locations.
 - b. SA Dental Service card is required for those students at Noarlunga clinic \$10.

- · During clinical training and placements students are required to comply with professional dress standards.
- Travel costs to/from clinical placements across the greater Adelaide region.
- Lab coats are required for many practical classes \$40
- Medical Examination Equipment:
 - a. Stethoscope approximately \$30-\$300
 - b. Pen torch approximately \$25

Adelaide Nursing School

Bachelor of Nursing AND Master of Clinical Nursing (pre-registration students

- During Clinical training and placements students are required to comply with professional dress standards. Uniforms are required for all students to wear while on clinical placement and during simulation teaching. The uniform consists of a scrub top and scrub pants and a minimum of 2 pairs are recommended.

- Adelaide Exposure Science and Health placements that involve lab work: Lab coat approximately \$40, available at The Adelaide Store
- For some field-based placements (WIL and/or PPP): Safety boots \$30 \$300 from safety stores

Faculty of Sciences, Engineering and Technology

All students

- Students are provided with a printing quota as Student Services entry; additional charges for printing once the quota is used up.
- · Required lecture notes will be available on the course MyUni site and students can print them at home or in the CAT Suite.
- Masters students are given a printing quota of 500 pages per semester. Research postgraduate students have no limit no charge.

School of Agriculture, Food and Wine students

- Binding of reports and other material cost is dependent on size of binding and materials used.
- Lab coats and safety glasses are required for many practical classes. These can be sourced commercially or from the <u>Adelaide Store</u>, at The Store at North Terrace:
 - a. Lab Coats (University branded) \$29.95
 - b. Safety Glasses \$9.95 (Safety glasses are provided in laboratory classes at Waite and Roseworthy)
- · Bachelor of Food & Nutrition Science students may require DCSI clearance (child-related) for their Industry placement if placed in a school.
- Field trips, which involve overnight accommodation, have an associated fee for the cost of providing food, accommodation, and transportation where applicable. Where the trip is compulsory, students are at liberty to organise their own accommodation & food. Alternative assessment may be available to students who are unable to attend field trips.
- OENOLOGY Courses in the External Wine Marketing & Wine Business programs (Faculty of the Professions) have a 4-5 day residential.
- School. Travel and accommodation costs are the responsibility of the student.
- Optional Q-Fever Vaccination for students taking Animal Science Courses approximately \$130-\$400.
- Optional study tours or study abroad associated with programs will have costs associated with travel and living expenses that will be the
 responsibility of the student.

School of Animal and Veterinary Sciences students

All programs

- Some courses may provide lecture notes for purchase. All notes will be available electronically for download from MyUni at no additional cost
- Lab coats and safety glasses are required for many practical classes. These can be sourced commercially or online at <u>Adelaide Store</u>, at The Store on the North Terrace campus and through Adelaide University Union representatives at Roseworthy campus:
 - a. Lab Coats (University branded) approximately \$35 for non-members, \$32 for members
 - b. Safety Glasses \$9.95 for non-members, \$8.95 for members
- Overalls (not white) and boots for any animal handling practicals available at <u>Adelaide Store</u>, at The Store on the North Terrace campus and through Adelaide Union representations at Roseworthy campus
 - a. Overalls approximately \$85 non-members, \$77 for members
 - b. Boots approximately \$70 non-members, \$63 for members
- Wellington / Gum Boots which extend well above the ankle are required for many animal handling and anatomy practical classes.
- Q-Fever Vaccination is required for Veterinary Bioscience, Doctor of Veterinary Medicine, Animal Science and Veterinary Technology students and costs approximately \$220-\$400. It is strongly recommended that Animal Behaviour students be vaccinated against Q Fever.
- Field trips in some courses have a food cost (usually only lunch). Field trips, which involve overnight accommodation, have an associated fee for the cost of providing food, accommodation, and transportation where applicable. Alternative assessment may be available to students who are unable to attend field trips. Additional costs exist if students wish to pursue voluntary activities or trips.
- Optional study tours or study abroad associated with programs will have costs associated with travel, visa requirements and travel vaccinations, and living expenses that will be the responsibility of the student.
- We recommend that students factor in the cost of purchasing their own laptop device.

Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience)

- Veterinary dissection kits are required for anatomy practical classes (Level II onwards). These can be sourced commercially or online at Adelaide Store, at The Store on the North Terrace campus and through Adelaide University Union representatives at Roseworthy campus for \$45 for members, \$40.50 for non-members.
- Uniform shirts will be required for AHEMS placements and can be sourced online at Adelaide Store, at the Store on the North Terrace Campus and through Adelaide University Union representatives at Roseworthy campus.
- Students can expect costs of travel, accommodation, and food for AHEMS placements.

Doctor of Veterinary Medicine

- Uniform shirts will be required for EMS placements and final year rotations in the Roseworthy Veterinary Hospital and can be sourced online at Adelaide Store, at the Store on the North Terrace Campus and through Adelaide University Union representatives at Roseworthy campus.
- A dark green set of scrubs and consultation tops will be required for the Level II DVM Desexing Clinic, companion animal and equine clinic rotations and placements.
- Overalls are required for equine and production clinical rotations and placements.
- A stethoscope is required from first year (available at Adelaide Store from approximately \$90 non-members, \$82 for members).

- Radiation dosimeters. Lost/late or non-return fee \$39.60.
- · Name badge. Lost fee \$12.
- Teaching Hospital Access Card and Locker Key Deposit \$20-\$50.

Bachelor of Science (Animal Science) and Bachelor of Science (Animal Behaviour)

- Uniform shirts will be required for placements/internships and can be sourced online at Adelaide Store, at the Store on the North Terrace Campus and through Adelaide University Union representatives at Roseworthy campus.
- Students can expect costs of travel, accommodation, and food for placements/internships.
- Name badge. Lost fee \$12.

Bachelor of Veterinary Technology

- Uniform shirts will be required for placements and can be sourced online at Adelaide Store, at the Store on the North Terrace Campus and through Adelaide University Union representatives at Roseworthy campus.
- A grey set of scrubs will be required for clinical skills classes from Level 1 and companion animal rotations and placements in Level III of the program.
- Students can expect costs of travel, accommodation and food for placements.
- · Name badge. Lost fee \$12.
- A stethoscope is required from Level I (available at <u>Adelaide Store</u> from approximately \$90, recommend Littman III Classic, approximately \$195).
- Radiation dosimeters. Lost/late or non-return fee \$39.60.
- Teaching Hospital Access Card and Locker Key Deposit \$20-\$50.
- Other recommended equipment in Level III for Clinical rotation/placements: watch with second hand; digital thermometer; nursing pouch; small calculator; dog lead; small clippers; ampoule opener; bandage scissors; forceps x 2 (further sourcing information will be provided during orientation week).

School of Architecture and Civil Engineering students

- Students will need appropriate drawing and model making equipment.
- · Costs involved in courses with 2D and 3D presentation work and printing can vary depending on materials etc.
- All required software is provided on University computers in ACE CAD Suite which are accessible 24/7.
- Students are encouraged to provide their own laptops and obtain personal software registrations when desired.
- The use of lockers in the Architecture fifth year studio will have a \$50 refundable deposit
- Students may be required to pay fees to attend multi day field trips. The cost varies based on destination and duration of the field trip. The students will have the option to participate in a variety of study tours which are costed on a case-by-case basis.
- 24-hour swipe-card access for Undergraduate and Masters students enrolled in CIVILENG and ENVENG courses (to CAT Suites).

School of Biological Sciences students

- Lab coats and safety glasses are required for all practical classes. These can be sourced commercially or from The Adelaide Store at the University of Adelaide if available. For those who forget on the day there is a pool of spare coats available.
- Field trips that involve overnight accommodation have an associated fee for the cost of providing food, accommodation, and transportation. In some cases, students are responsible for organising their own food at their own cost. Students are expected to have the appropriate clothes. Alternative assessment may be available to students who are unable to attend field trips.

School of Chemical Engineering students

- Costs associated with course materials may be applicable for some courses and made available through the library.
- Students purchase their own safety glasses and lab coats for lab projects.
- Voluntary Plant Tour for Level 3 and 4 students. Indicative cost will be between \$100-\$300 depending on location, travel and living costs.
- Additional costs associated with the New Colombo Plan Study Tour for Special Studies in Chemical Engineering outside of NCP grant funding.
- Level 1 Mining students contribute towards cost of field trip. Travel and accommodation for 4-day field trip approx. \$100. Alternative assessment is available to students who are unable to attend field trips.

School of Electrical and Mechanical Engineering students

Electrical and Electronic Students

- Limited lockers available for student use: students provide own padlocks.
- Toolkit for first year students in Analog Electronics and subsequent electronic courses can be purchased for \$88*. The cost of the tools is subsidised by the school; however students are at liberty to purchase them elsewhere. The toolkits are used in several courses throughout the program.
- Oscilloscope probes for second year students in Electronic Circuits can be purchased for \$33*. The cost of the probes is subsidised by the school, however students are at liberty to purchase them elsewhere. The probes are used in several courses throughout the program.

Mechanical Engineering students

- Limited lockers available for student use: students provide own padlocks.
- Tools for first year students in Electronic Systems can be purchased for \$88*. The cost of the tools is subsidised by the school; however, students are at liberty to purchase them elsewhere.
- Hands-on training and other laboratory activities may require students to wear steel-capped shoes. Student to provide own closed-toe shoes. Steel-capped overshoes are available in some areas.

School of Physics, Chemistry and Earth Sciences students

- Lab coats and safety glasses are required for Chemistry practical classes. These can be purchased from the Adelaide Store located on North Terrace campus or online.
- Hand lens can be signed out at no cost for first year Geology practical classes for the duration of the course. If the kit is lost, the student is liable for the replacement cost \$20.
- Students progressing past 1st year Geology are expected to purchase a hand lens, field notebook, compass, and safety glasses for use in the field.
- Field trips that involve overnight accommodation have an associated fee for the cost of providing food, accommodation, and transportation, payable via the online shop prior to commencement of the field trip. In some cases, students are responsible for organising their own food at their own cost. Students are expected to have the appropriate clothes.
